8th. GCO School for Floral Design Judges - PRELIMINARY INFORMATION

Proposed dates: 2025 - 2026 - 2027

Traditionally, the GCO School has had two sessions per year, each of these sessions are for 3 days, in the Spring (April) and the Fall (October). Each day started with Sign-in and coffee at 8:30am – 12:00noon and 1:00pm to 2:00 or 2:30pm approximately.

Total learning time: 3 years x 2 Sessions x 3 days = 18 days

Proposed location for the School: Landscape Ontario

7856 Fifth Line, Milton, Ontario K9T 2X8

Requirements for admission:

1. Completion of the Basic Course in Flower Arranging as prescribed by GCO and

taught by an accredited GCO judge during the 2023, 2024 and 2025 seasons.

2. Two exhibitor cards from the decorative/design classes of a flower show during

the 2024 – 2025 season, signed by the Show Chairman or Judge. These exhibits

need not be from a standard show.

Cost for Admission:

<u>Ten years ago</u>, the first cost was for the "Notice of Intent to Register" \$10.00 and the fees for each session was \$85.00. This pricing obviously will change in 2025 and will be increased.

The benefits of becoming an accredited Floral Design Judge are many including some of the following:

- A gold star education in Floral Design with entry to a world of international exposure.
- Peer accreditation, which qualifies you to judge and teach Floral Design.
- Gives you eligibility to become a member of Judges Council, which opens a gateway to further learning.
- Acknowledgement of accomplishment and success from the Garden Club
- An opportunity to meet expert instructors and Designers and make many friends with like-minded individuals.
