Flower Show General Rules

1. The competition is open to any paid-up District 6 member.
2. All entries are judged according to the Ontario Judging and Exhibiting Standards for Horticulture and Floral Design, Publication 34, 2003 Edition (OJES).
3. All entries must be placed between 8:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. Judging starts promptly at 9:15 a.m.
4. Exhibitors are responsible for completing an entry tag for each entry in Division II and for correct placement of their entries. Entry cards will be provided in pre-determined spaces for all classes in Division I and Division III.
5. Entries are to remain in place until the show closes at 1:00 p.m.
6. All reasonable care will be taken of exhibitors' property, but District 6 will not be responsible for loss or damage.
7. The decision of the judge is final. Ribbons will be awarded on merit.

Flower Show General Rules (continued)

DIVISION I - Design Rules:

8. Fresh plant material may be obtained from any source.
9. No artificial plant material or cut fruit is allowed.
10. Accessories and dried plant materials are permitted as allowed by the schedule.
11. Only one entry per exhibitor is permitted in any design class.
12. All classes must be pre-registered by March 1st, with:

DIVISION II - Horticultural Rules:

13. The exhibitor is permitted two entries per class, provided they are of different cultivars, except for Class 18 where 4 entries of different colours are allowed.
14. Potted plants must have been owned by the exhibitor for at least 3 months prior to the show.
15. Exhibitors must provide their own containers.
16. Classes will be staged on tables 30” from the floor.
17. Classes may be sub-divided at the discretion of the show chairs.

DIVISION III - Special Exhibit Rules:

18. This class must be pre-registered with Nancy McComb.
19. Special Exhibits are judged for both horticultural perfection and design attributes.
20. Plants must have compatible cultural requirements but with variations of colour, form, texture, and pattern for visual effect.

District 6 Flower Show Schedule

DIVISION I - Design "Spring is Simply Grand"

- Class 1. *A River Runs Through It* - A water viewing design.
Space: 30" x 30", height unrestricted. 5 entries.
- Class 2. *A Hiker's Dream* - A design using footwear.
Space: 30" x 30", height unrestricted. 5 entries.
- Class 3. *Sunrise, Sunset* - A duo design in the same container.
Space: 30" x 30", height unrestricted. 5 entries.
- Class 4. *A Walk Along the Trail* - A naturalistic design using plant materials as they are found in nature.
Space: 30" x 30", height unrestricted. 5 entries.
- Class 5. *Tea Time in the Country* - A small design in a tea cup, a design 5½" - 10" and no larger than 10" in any direction. 8 entries.

DIVISION II - Horticulture

- Class 6. Collection of spring flowers, 3 different cultivars, named
- Class 7. Collection of spring flowers, same cultivar, named
- Class 8. Forced branch cut to no more than 30" from the top of the container
- Class 9. Helleborus (Hellebore) - 1 stem
- Class 10. House plant grown for flowers (must be in bloom)
- Class 11. House plant grown for foliage
- Class 12. Hyacinthus (Hyacinth) - 1 scape
- Class 13. Iris, Bearded - 1 stalk
- Class 14. Iris, Siberian (or similar type) - 3 stalks
- Class 15. Narcissus (Daffodil) - 1 scape
- Class 16. Narcissus (Daffodil) - collection of 3 scapes of different cultivars
- Class 17. Narcissus (Daffodil) miniature - 3 scapes all the same.
(No leaves should be displayed with Narcissus exhibits.)
- Class 18. Tulipa (Tulip), any colour - 1 stem
- Class 19. Tulipa (Tulip) - collection of 3 different cultivars
- Class 20. Any other bulb, corm, rhizome or tuber (i.e. Allium, Chionodoxa, Checkered Lily, Crocus, Winter Aconite, etc.) - 3 stems or scapes
- Class 21. Perennial, any plant under 6" (6" refers to the growing habit, not the cut length) - 3 stems
- Class 22. Succulent (includes Cacti), 1 pot, may contain more than 1 plant as long as they are all the same cultivar
- Class 23. Any other cultivar not mentioned - 1 stem or spray

DIVISION III - Special Exhibits

- Class 24. *Picture Perfect: A Wayside Design* (see definition in OJES pg. 108)
Picture Frame Succulent Garden: picture frame may be up to but not exceed 30" x 30". It can be displayed flat or exhibitor may provide an upright support. 8 entries.
